There was a strong gathering of his 105 and 1 RAR mates at the Albany Creek Chapel and the entry of his casket carried by his Vietnam gun detachment brought tears to many a hardened veteran.

In February, the Queensland Chapter 23 of the International Society of the 173rd Airborne Brigade (Separate) presented Val Voyzey with a special Award for Courage for Barry. The last words of this famed certificate say it all: 'You have acted with honour, with dignity, and with the tenacity and courage that leaves a legacy for all ex-soldiers to emulate.'
