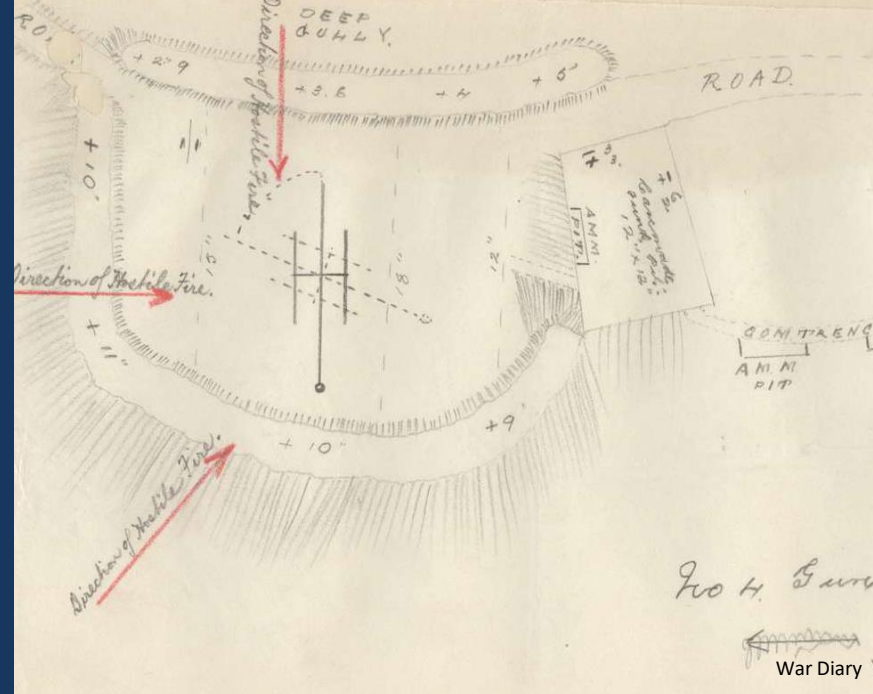

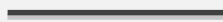

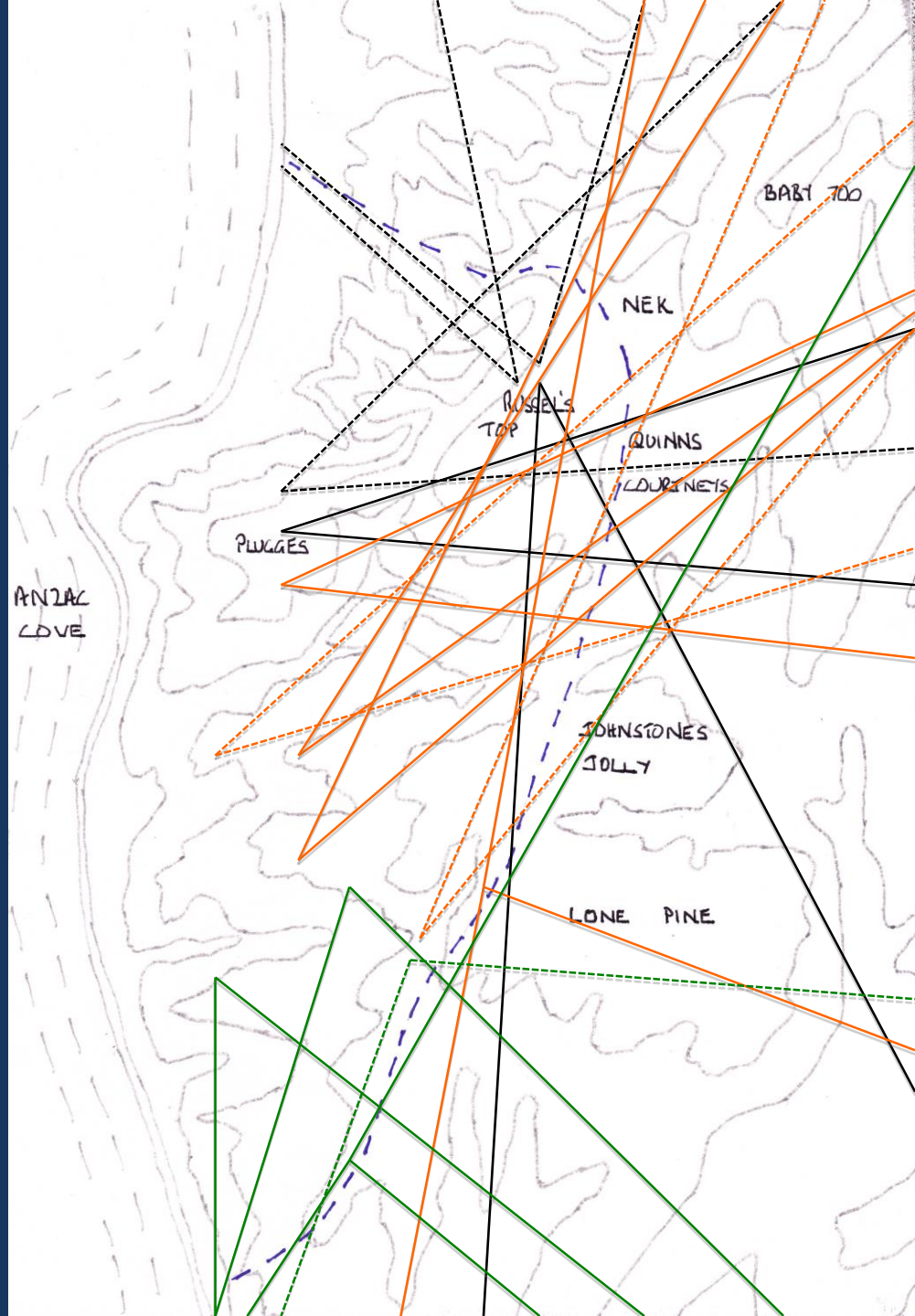

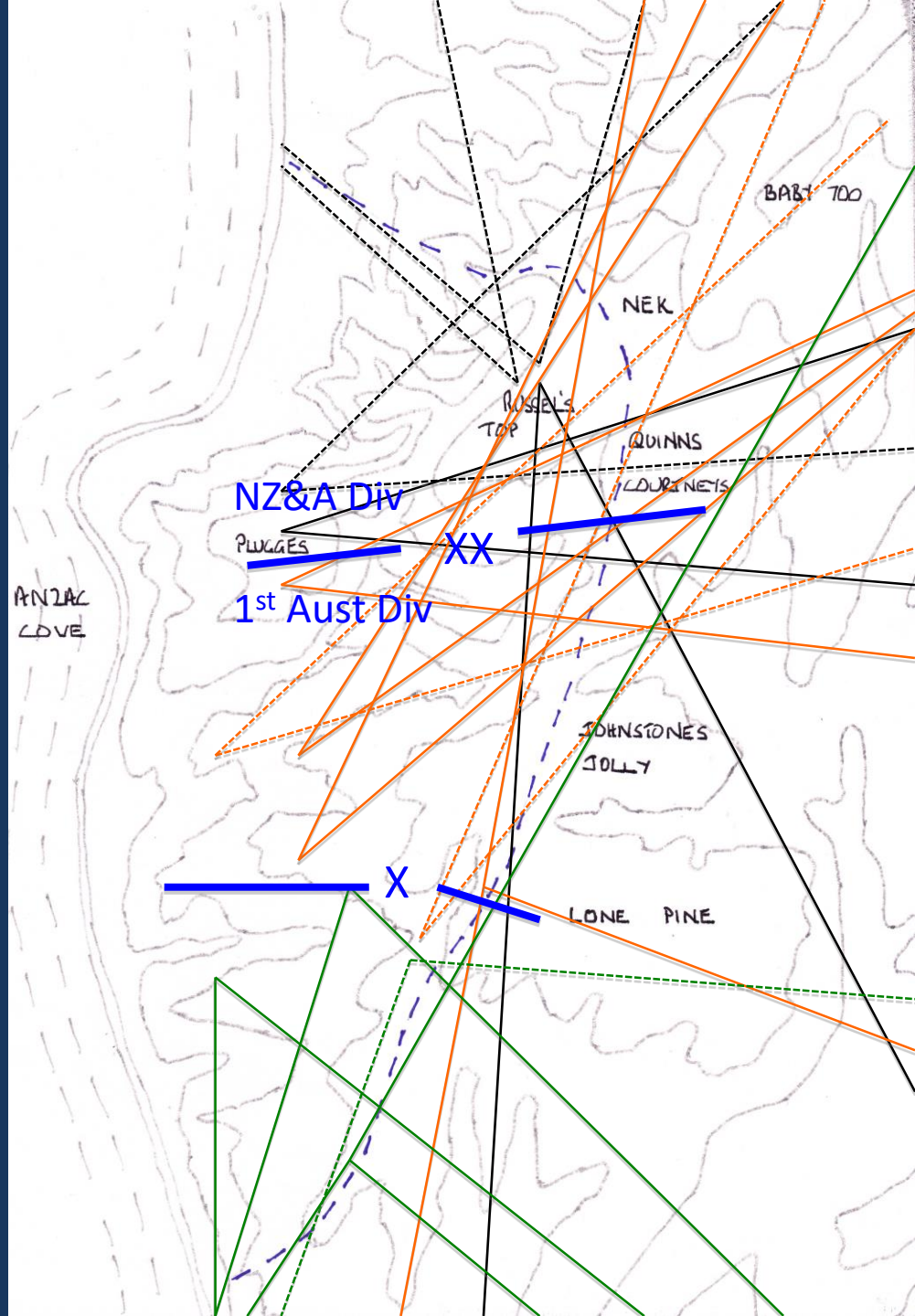

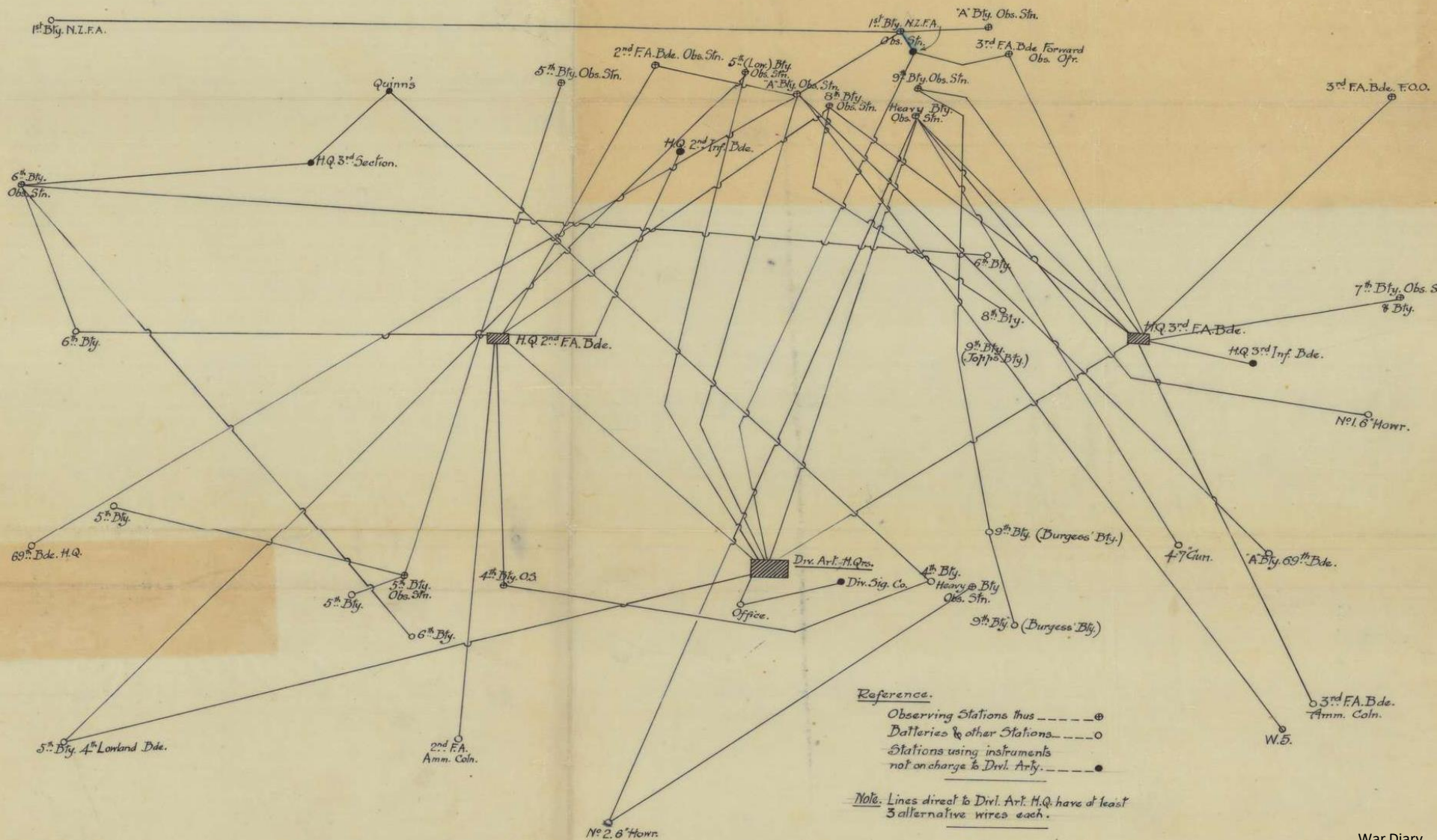
DIAGRAM OF TELEPHONE COMMUNICATIONS.

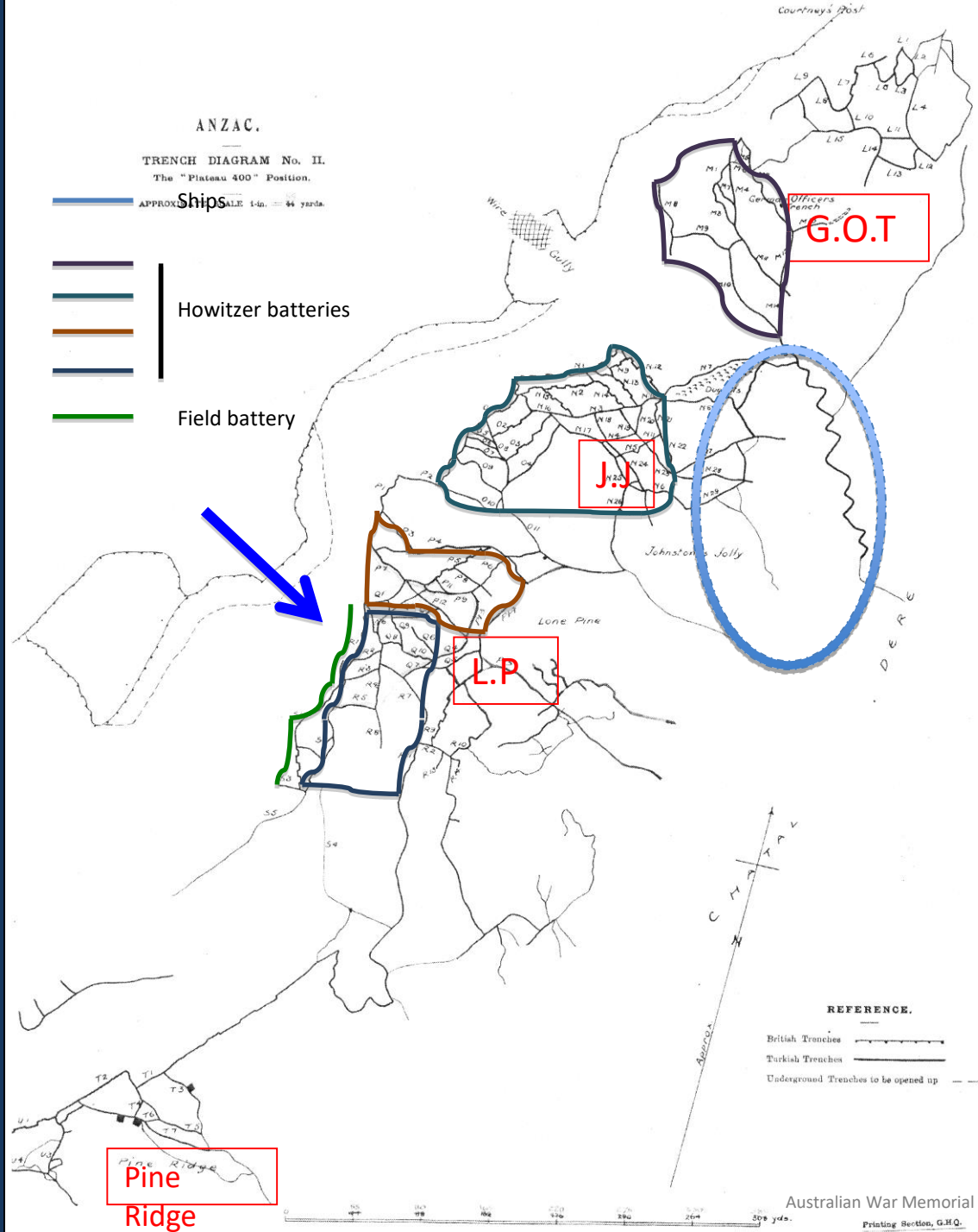

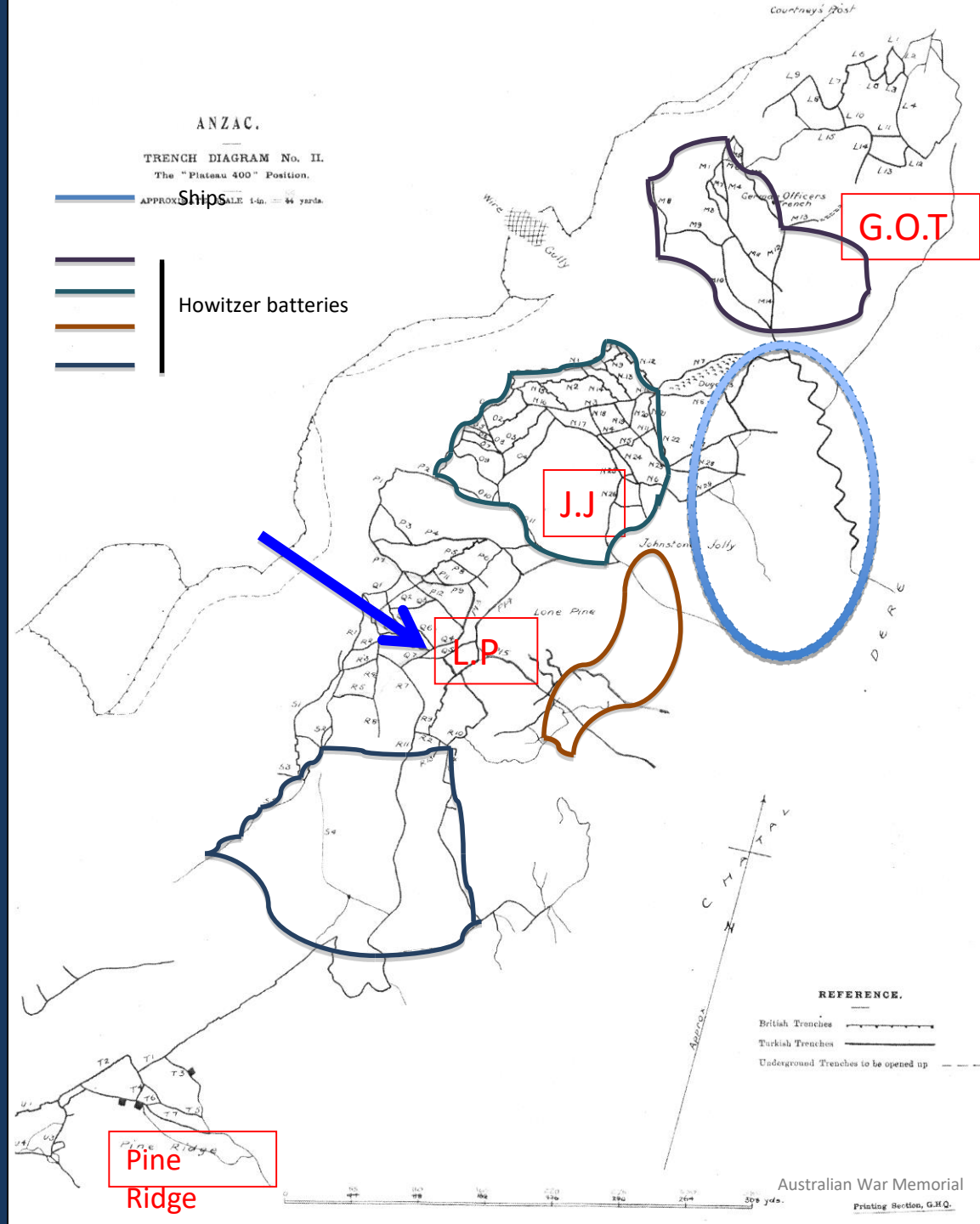
LONE PINE FIREPLAN

AFTER 1730 Hrs



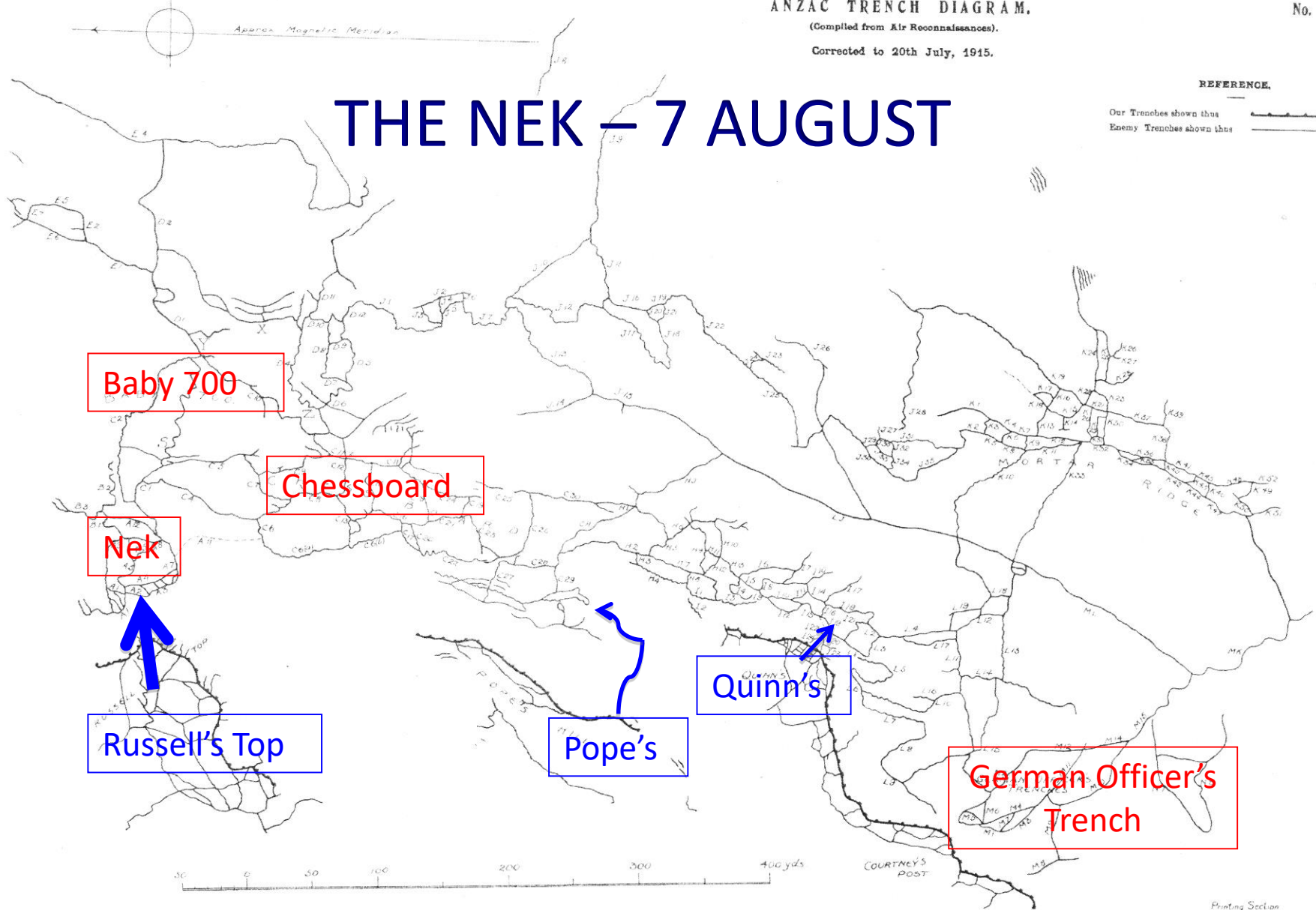

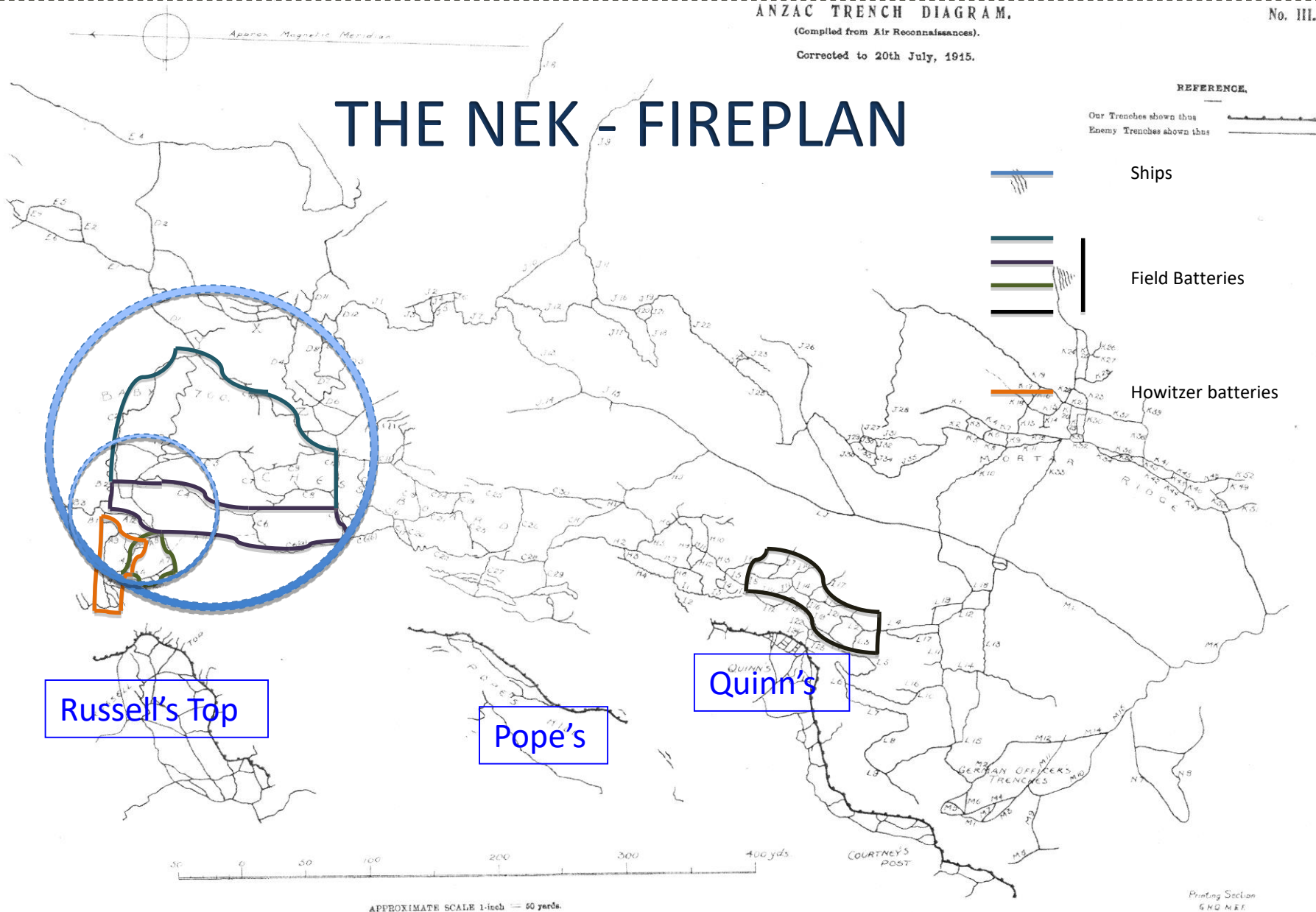

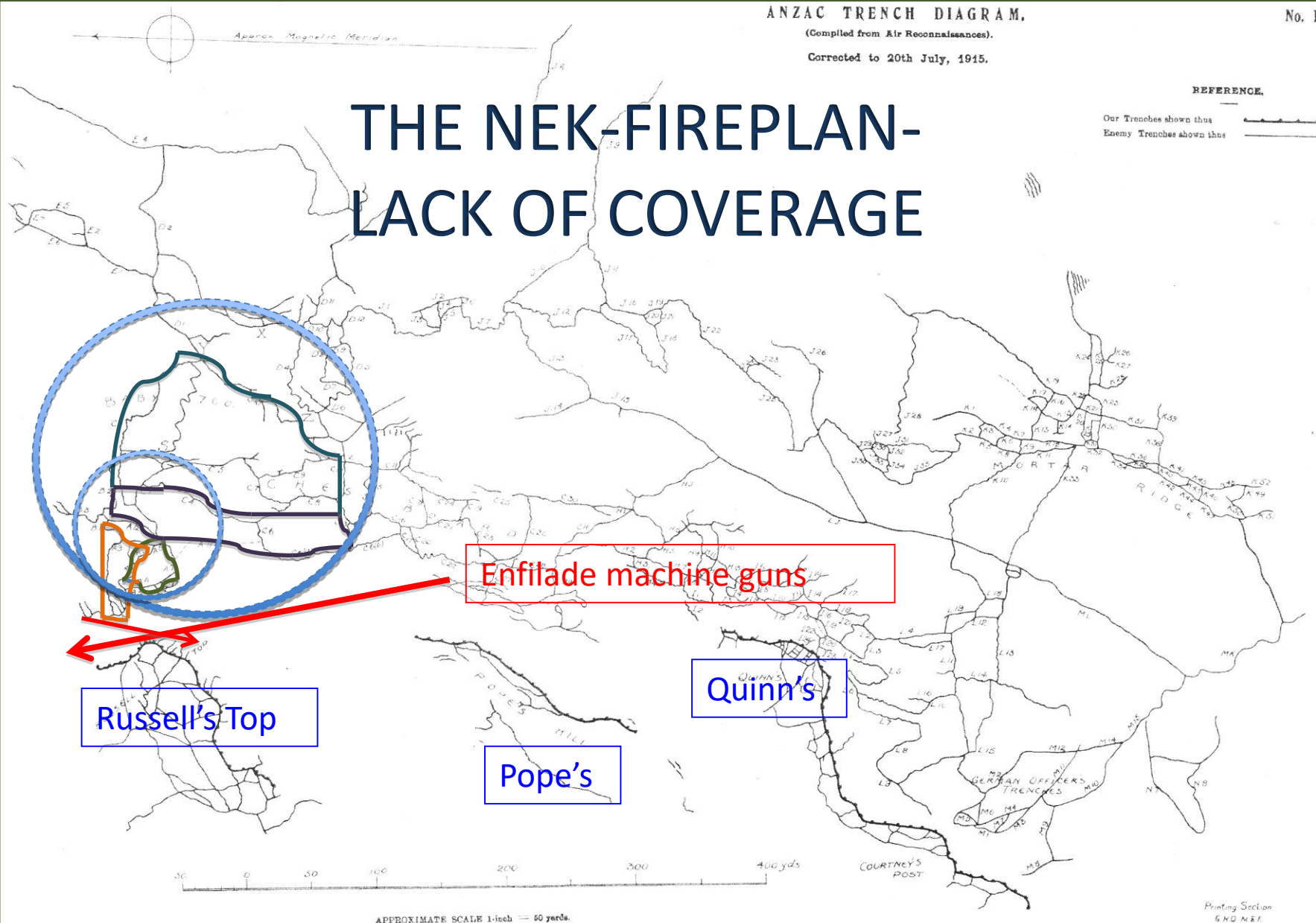

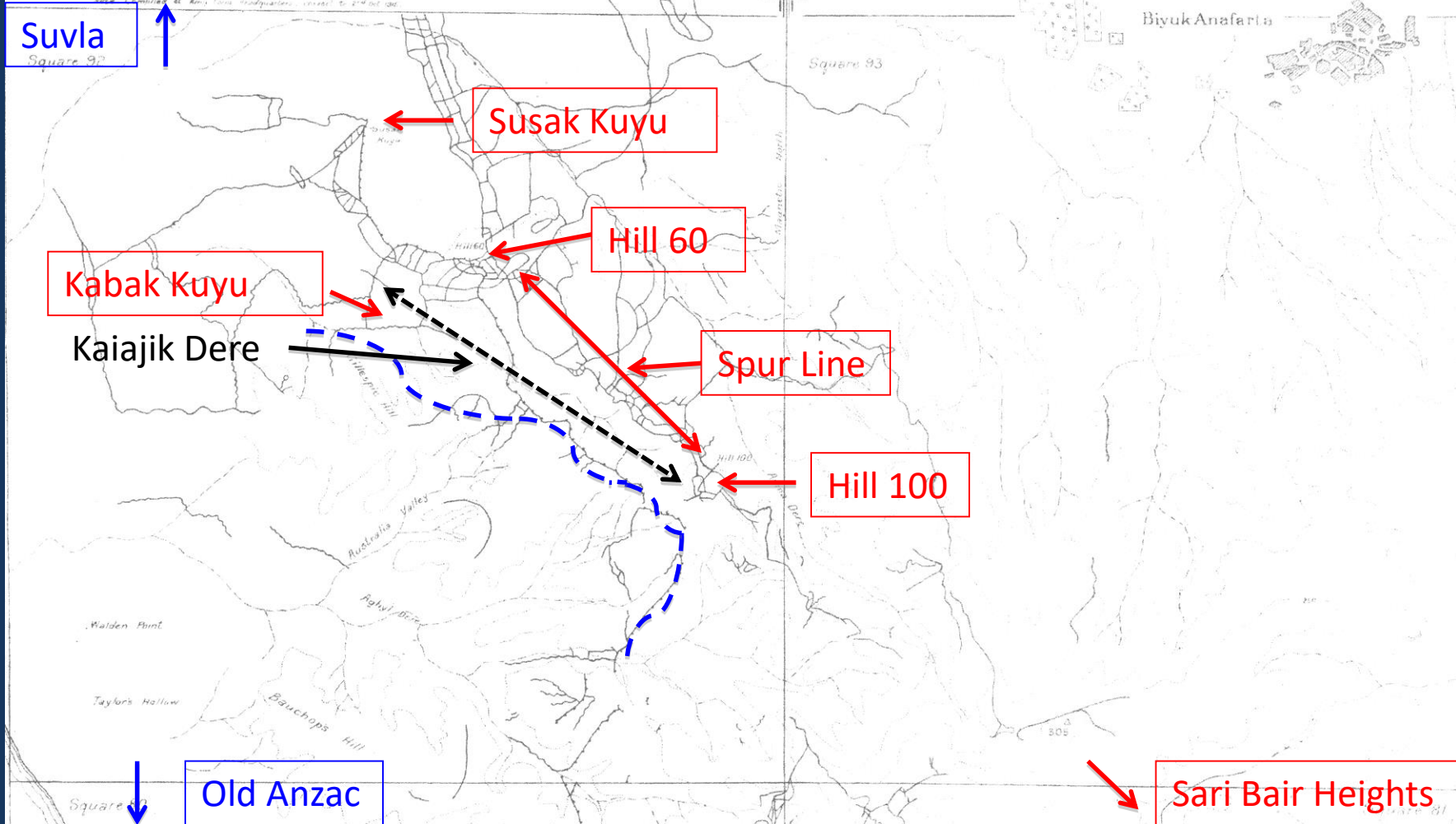

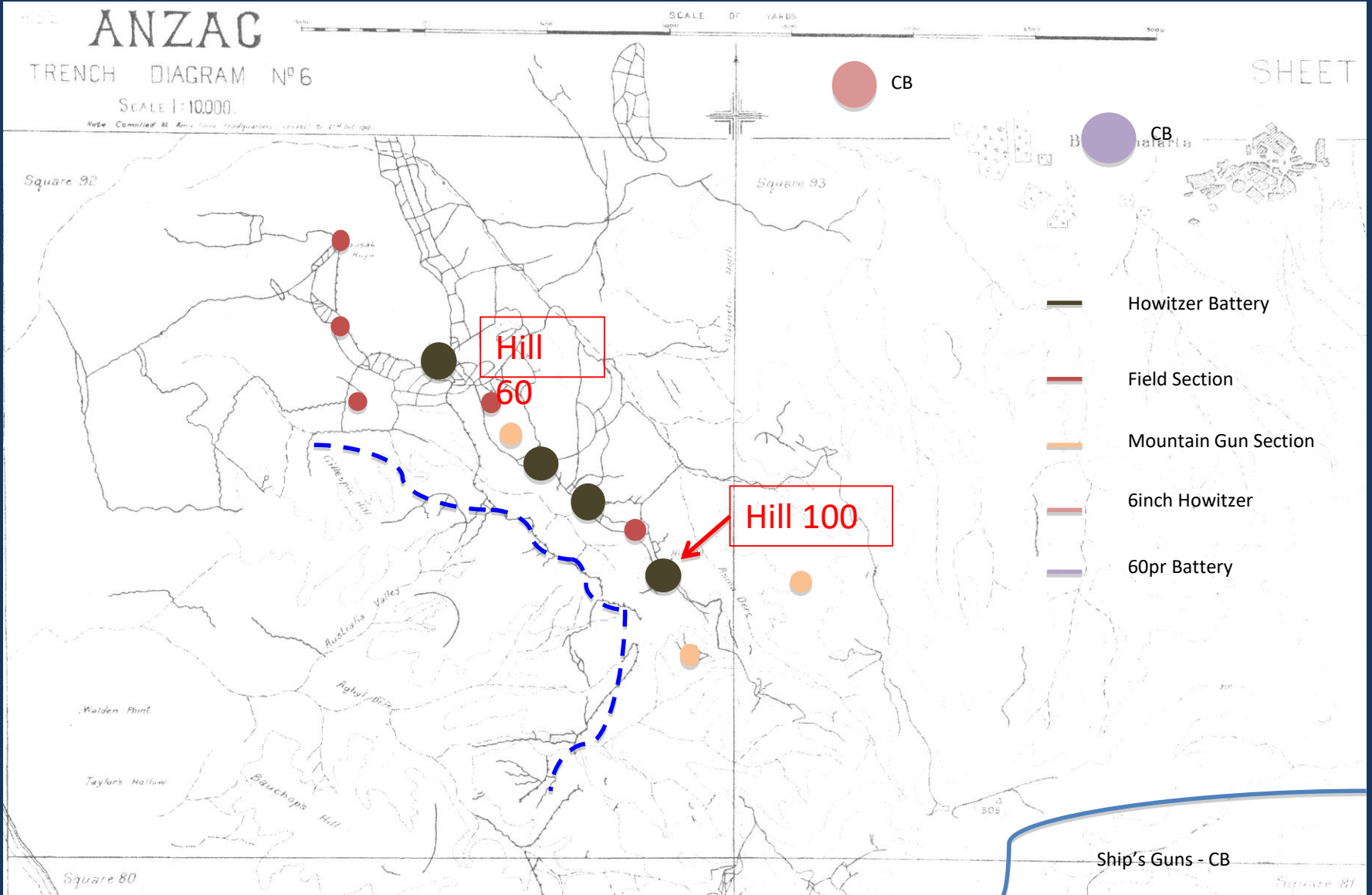

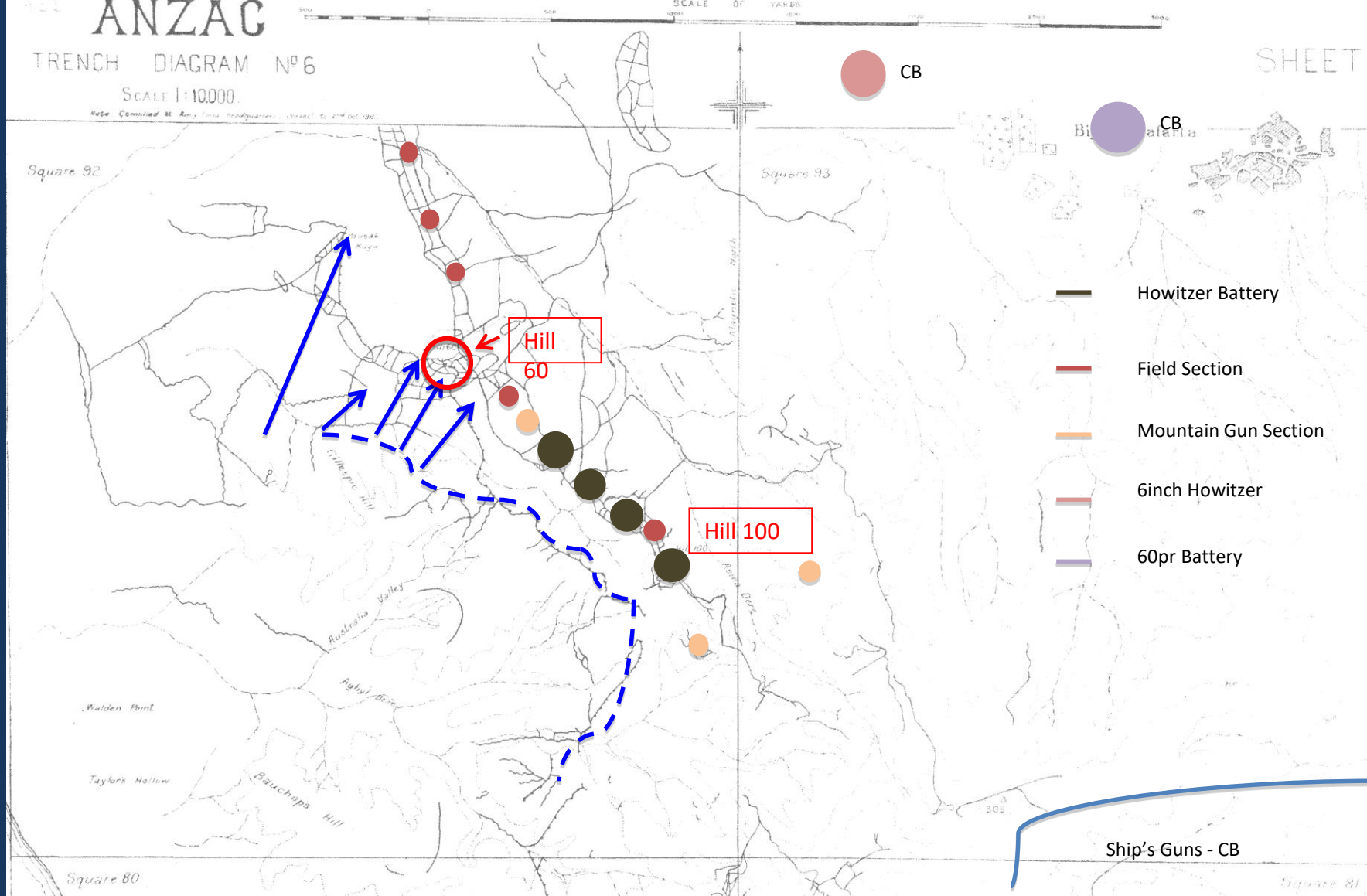

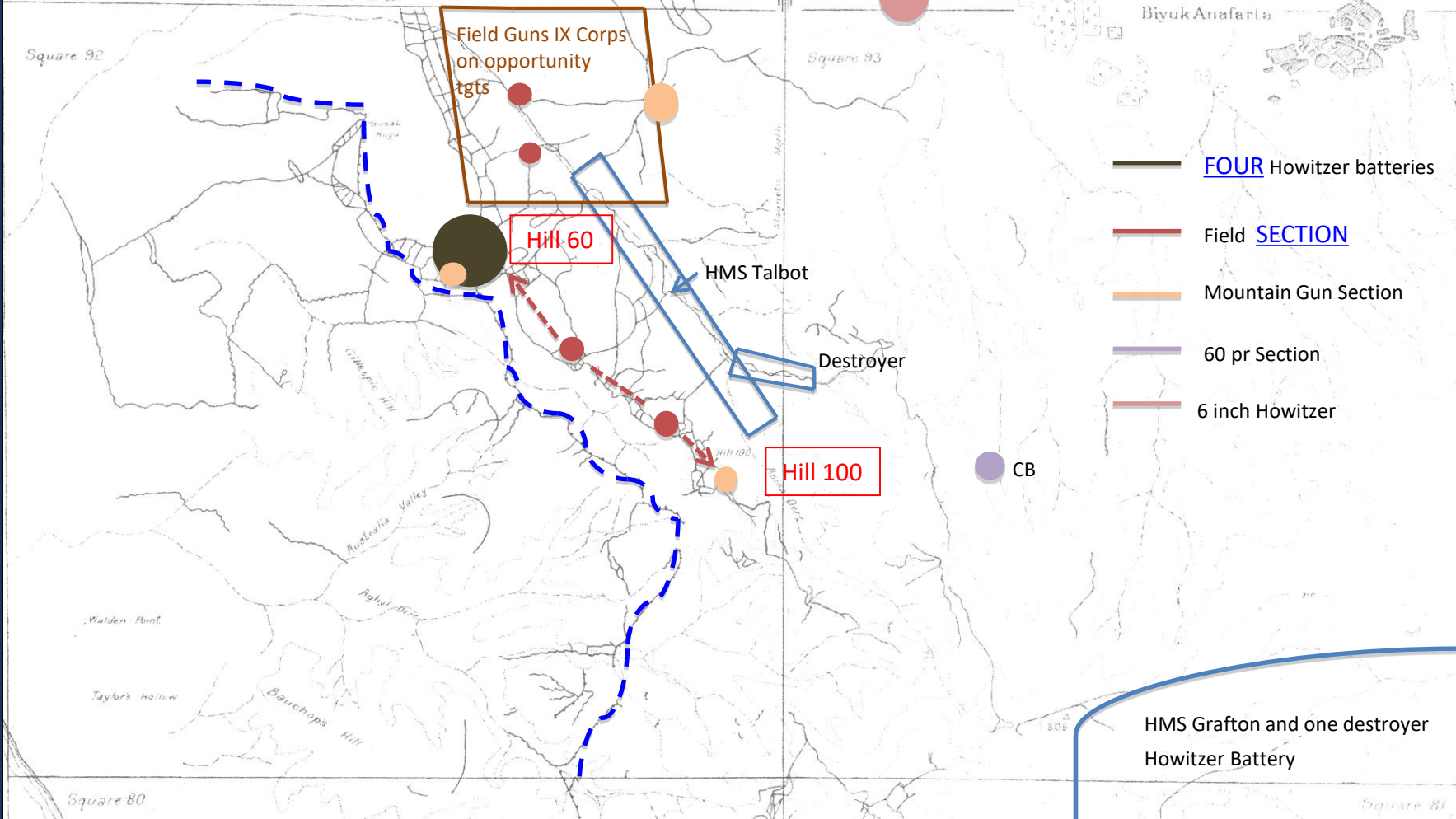

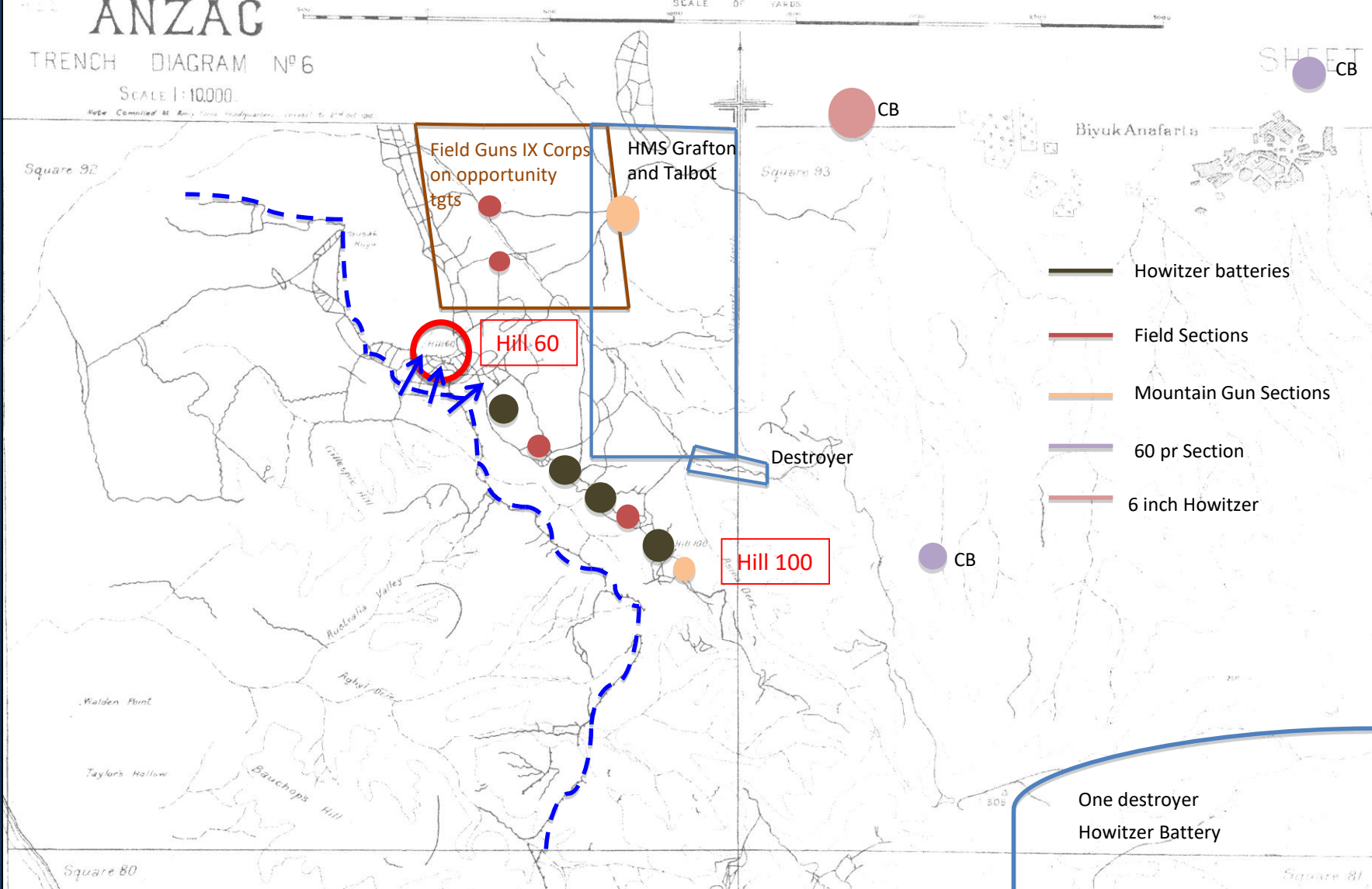
