Major Watson entered the Royal Military College, Duntroon in 2003 and upon graduation in 2004 was posted to the 'A' Field Battery, 4th Field Regiment. Whilst deployed Major Watson was employed as the Joint Fires Cell Commander in Musa Qalah for the majority of the period however also fulfilled the Battery Commander position and Forward Observer role in Patrol Base Woqab. Major Watson participated in both Combat Team and Battle Group operations contributing to the Joint Fires and Effects planning and execution.

In 2014, Major Watson promoted and was appointed as Battery Commander 105th Battery, 1st Regiment, Royal Australian Artillery. Major Watson wishes to pursue Regimental Command after gaining strategic experience in either AHQ or MSC as a MA or Staff Officer.
