

A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear Fellow Gunners,

The main issue discussed in the first half of this year has been the Force Structure Review which culminated in the Minister's Statement in May. You will all have been addressed by commanding officers on the broad decisions in the Review particularly those affecting the RAA.

The main changes are:

1st Field Regiment converts to Ready Reserve progressively over five years commencing 1 Jan 92. All three batteries will be Ready Reserve and support Ready Reserve Battalions in 6 Brigade. About 25% of the Regiment will remain ARA.

The batteries of 8/12th Medium Regiment will continue to support their infantry battalions, 3 RAR and 5/7 RAR but will become independent batteries when the medium battery is relocated to Darwin, currently planned for later in the decade. Headquarters of 8/12th Medium Regiment may be reduced but remain in location for some years yet.

16th Air Defence Regiment will be one of only two units outside 6 Brigade to have Ready Reserve. Over five years from 1992, it will convert its ARes, ARes (Special Conditions) and approximately 30 ARA positions to Ready Reserve.

131st Divisional Locating Battery will have a reduced ARA Component which will command the battery and provide support to the ODF, and an ARes element to support the ARes and Ready Reserve Brigades.

Training Command is to lose approximately 20% of its manpower and this percentage is likely to be applied to the School of Artillery. Options to make the changes necessary will be examined over the next 12 months.

On the positive side, the Headquarters of 6/13th Field Regiment in Adelaide is to be authorised with 16th Battery in Tasmania and 48th Battery in Adelaide coming under command. Also one field battery to support 11 Brigade is authorised.

The arrangements for these changes will be detailed in a Land Command Implementation Plan to be issued later this year.

On other matters, the detachments of 111 Air Defence Battery (Light) aboard the HMAS Success and HMAS Westralia returned safely recently, with their reputations enhanced and the RAN very aware of the units capability and flexibility. The unit reacted to the task at very short notice and

has received many compliments on their performance. Congratulations to all involved.

Lieutenant Colonel Andy Hodgkinson also deployed to the Gulf heading the British Army Technical Intelligence team. He has addressed several units on his assessment on the Iraqi artillery and his experiences.

I have represented the Regiment at a number of parades this year. The parade to mark the amalgamation of 2/15th Field Regiment and 10th Medium Regiment was held at the Batman Avenue Barracks in April. Although the loss of a regiment is not a happy occasion, the parade was a success and well attended by guests and families. Both 22 Field Battery (from 2/15th Field Regiment) and 38th Medium Battery (from 10th Medium Regiment) performed extremely well on their ARTEP exercise this year, congratulations.

This month I attended the parade in Townsville to make the award of the US Unit Meritorious Commendation to the 1st Battalion Group earned in South Vietnam in 1965/66. 105 Field Battery was part of the Battalion Group and was represented on the parade in a composite guard comprising gunners, engineers, tankies and aviators and, with a detachment of 161 Field Battery RNZA, manned the guns holding ground for the Battalion Group. All original members of 105 Field Battery and those serving in 105 Field Battery are entitled to wear the Unit Meritorious Commendation on their right breast, congratulations.

Also this month I attended the parade to mark the award of the Freedom of Entry to the Municipality of Rockdale to 23rd Field Regiment. The Regiment is held in high regard in the community and a number of the aldermen on the Rockdale Council, including the Mayor, are former members of the Regiment. Preparation for such an occasion places considerable demands on a unit and all involved are congratulated on a most successful day.

The Corps Conference is being held at North Head from 7 to 9 November with the Master Gunner, St James' Park, General Sir Martin Farndale addressing the Conference on the first day.

Finally, the RAA National Museum is open every Saturday and Sunday from 10am to 4 pm and attracting good numbers. In addition many service groups in Sydney are making visits during the week. If you haven't seen the Museum yet, take the opportunity next time you are in Sydney.

NOTES FROM THE SO1 ARTY

1. There are a number of issues currently before DARTY relating to Training Requirement Adviser (TRA) and Training Adviser (TA) responsibilities. For those who are unsure of these definitions, the TRA is appointed to decide how many students need to be trained each year on what type of course. The need for a new course is also in the TRAs area of responsibility. The TA on the other hand determines the content of courses. In general, HQ Trg Comd is the TA for non Corps courses with MS and SCMA the TRA. DARTY is the TRA and TA for RAA courses.

2. DARTY in conjunction with Land Command Units, conducted a review of ARA Officer Training in 1990. The review confirmed that we are on the right track with the progression, style and content of our courses. A few changes were considered necessary and have been included in a rewrite of specifications. Concurrently, a study on ARes Officer Training was conducted in Nov 90 with interim training specifications issued in Dec 90. Formal adoption of the review recommendation will be held pending the outcome of the Force Structure Review (FSR) and an analysis of the FSR impact on Officer Training.

3. DARTY is to conduct a major review on RAA Other Rank Training in 1991. The review will examine career progression, as it relates to training, course design and content. The reviews will be dispatched for comment in Aug 91, discussed by an experienced panel in Oct 91 and results issued in Nov 91.

A WORD FROM THE REGIMENTAL MASTER GUNNER

1. Recently I attended a reunion of the 4th Field Regiment (South Vietnam) Association. The reunion was held in Townsville and hosted by 4th Field Regiment. In 1967-68 the gun batteries were 106 and 108, while on the second tour, 106 and 107 were in action. Headquarter Battery was of course operational in both tours and 161 Battery (RNZA) was under command of the Regiment during both trips.

2. The reunion, which lasted a week, was attended by nearly ninety members, their wives and children. The week was a great success mainly due to the efforts of 4th Field Regiment and in particular, 108th Field Battery. Perhaps the highlight of the week for some was the trip to High Range with 108 Battery, and the chance to man the guns during live firing. It was over 20 years in some cases since many had been that close to a gun, but it didn't take long to get the old routine back. One old BQMS - who shall remain nameless, reckons the Hamel gun is nearly as good as the 25 Pounders he used to be a layer on.

3. One thing that was highlighted during the week was the actual lack of recorded history of the Regiment's time in South Vietnam. Many individuals have lots of photos and slides, but there is very little written. This lack of

recorded history is about to be rectified, but it will take someone many hours of research to come up with a history and even then, much could be missed.

4. Similar things are happening today. Here at DARTY we maintain the annual reports from all RAA Units, but some are very brief and sketchy, some I must admit are very good and include press cuttings, nominal roles etc. My point is that today's events are tomorrow's history and unless we record significant events, some poor blighter in 20 years time will have to start all over again.

5. Speaking of history, the RAA Museum is going from strength to strength. Anyone who could spare a few hours every couple of months and would like to be a guide at the museum, get in touch with me and we'll work something out. The job can be very rewarding and anyone can have a go. Civies are worn by all guides so rank doesn't matter at all.

6. Recent happenings at the Museum include the engines from the graveyard being moved down to the engine room, the acquisition of another search light, and work has now started on restoration of the old Number 4 Mark 7 Radar. There is still a long way to go with the Museum, but it's not all going to happen overnight. While money and a labour force are key elements to the Museum's future, your support - at all levels - is vital to the preservation of RAA History.

7. A lot is said by "old" soldiers about the young soldiers of today. What a lot of "old" soldiers forget is that they were once young gunnies or officers themselves. Many were in more trouble than Flash Gordon, but went on to prove themselves - some in action - as they matured. One of the old soldiers at the reunion in Townsville summed it up by saying "the soldiers of today are as good as, if not better, than the soldiers of our era". Given the chance, the "young" soldiers will prove themselves, and go on to be "old" soldiers of tomorrow.

NOTES FROM SO2 PERS MAJ S. JOSKE

1. It is an interesting year to be the CA Arty/SO2 Pers DARTY in the Military Secretary's Office. There can be no doubt that the Force Structure Review, Defence Regional Support Review and the slowing of promotion to Lieutenant Colonel and Colonel will all have major impact on the Junior Officer Posting Planning Cycle (JOPPC) and individual career aspirations. It is a time of great uncertainty that will need much of our patience, flexibility and understanding. I wish to highlight a number of issues that have, or will have, affected officer's careers:

a. The second MS Newsletter for 1991 has been published and discusses the recent promotion boards. Officers that were considered by a 1991 PAC should contact the AMS1 or the AMS on (06) 265 4122

or 265 5250 respectively for advice on their grading. Officers are encouraged to discuss their clearance grade with their CO and me, or LTCOL Greg Molyneux, should they have any queries.

- b. The JOPPC is currently behind schedule by one month. The effect of this will be to delay the issue of general appointment posting orders until 30 Jul 91. Posting orders for specialist appointments such as overseas exchange, full time study and RMC/ADFA, are being issued as they are confirmed. The JOPPC is currently into Phase II, where MS2 approves the corps nominations for non-corps and corps appointments. This process should be completed by 30 Jun 91.
- c. The process of dispatching back pages of 1990 EDROs is now complete after a delay of several months caused by staff shortages in MS6. If you have not received your back page by 15 Jun 91 you should advise your unit adjutant/2IC who should then advise me and I will arrange for another copy to be dispatched.
- d. Annual Career Assessments (ACA) will be issued for Captains and Majors this year. The reasoning behind the issue of ACA lies in the volumes of the Cross Report. In short it was felt that officers should be provided with an annual assessment of their overall performance, not their performance in the current reporting period. Last year ACA were introduced for Majors only and they took the form of a narrative letter. This was a time consuming exercise and because they were new they underwent three changes of style and format. Hence they were issued too late and were out of date. This year the format is different and I believe it offers more comparative information. I will have the Captain's ACA issued by 3 Jun 91 and the Majors by 30 Jun 91. The fact that we are issuing them early is designed to offer feedback as soon as possible. This has one side effect, that is that you may find the comments on your future employment (the last section of the ACA) may be overtaken by the effects of the Force Structure Review and the Defence Regional Support Reviews. I will notify any officer who is effected as soon as possible. I ask that you critically examine the structure, style and content of your ACA and feel free to provide me with both positive and negative feedback as deemed necessary.

2. I am happy to answer any questions on postings or career matters at any time (telephone (06) 265 5790). All I ask is that you talk to your BC/CO before and after calling, to ensure that they are aware of our discussion and its outcome.

CA RAA SCMA PERS NOTES

RSM Course

1. There is a possibility that two RSM Courses will be conducted in 1992. In the past WO2 in either RSM or BSM equivalent positions have been nominated to attend the course. With an increased Corps individual training requirement it is expected, in the long term, that WO2 in their second appointment will be panelled for the course.

2. It is a requirement to qualify on the RSM's course prior to an appointment as an RSM in the RAA.

3. DARTY have suggested that the course syllabus be examined and reduced from ten to eight weeks.

Farewell to WO1 "Junior" Suthers

4. The RAA have not only the senior soldier in the RSM of the Army but also the senior soldier in length of service in the Army. WO1`Junior' Suthers has taken his retirement after more than 37 years service in the RAA. The Corps wishes both Junior and Beryl well for the future, they are currently building and intend settling in the Canungra area.

PSO Congratulations

- 5. Congratulations to the following successful 1991 PSO candidates:
- a. WO1 P.J. Bruce, OAM, to be posted Career Adviser, SCMA;
- b. WO1 P.K. Dover to be posted QM 131 Divisional Locating Battery; and
- c. WO1 G.J. Ford to be posted QM 23 Fd Regt.

The Annual RAA Promotion Series

6. At the Annual Promotion Series, all soldiers who are qualified for promotion to SGT or above by 30 June of the current year and who are recommended on their last annual PR66 are considered for promotion. It is a fact of life that not everyone can be promoted and that some soldiers who perhaps feel they deserve promotion, will not be promoted. They may be good quality soldiers, but there are limits to the number of establishment positions available. Generally there are many good soldiers available to fill positions, although some ECN and ranks are occasionally in short supply. Therefore, everyone must be given equal consideration and only the best soldiers are selected for promotion. That is why the promotion system is based on merit. To maintain a small, quality force ready for war requires that only the best be promoted.

7. Prior to the Promotion Series the Career Advisers RAA and the SO2 independently conduct a review of all soldiers recommended for promotion and develop their own recommendations for clearance for promotion. They examine:

- a. quality and consistency of performance, particularly over the last three years;
- b. the written comments contained in the report especially those made by the soldier's CO;
- c. the experience the soldier has gained in trade and rank;
- d. performance on courses:
 - (1) Subj 1 provides an evaluation of the soldier against his peers in an all corps environment;
 - (2) Subj 4 gives an indication of trade ability.
- e. any offences, including when they occurred, the nature of the offence and penalty imposed;

- f. the unit and job in which the soldier was employed;
- g. any compassionate or medical circumstances which may have effected performance;
- h. any information regarding the harshness or leniency of the Assessing Officers or Commanding Officers; and
- i. the soldier's peers to gain a perception of relative merit.

The Personnel Advisory Committee (Other Ranks) (PAC(OR))

8. Once the independent review has been completed, the PAC (phase 1) meets. Headed by the SO1 of PM GP, the PAC (Phase 1) includes the career Advisers, RMG and the SO2 of PM3, the section of SCMA responsible for the RAA. During the PAC (Phase 1), candidates for promotion are discussed and compared. Following this comparison, adjustments are made to any recommendations and these become the PAC's recommendation to the PAC (Phase 2).

9. While the authority for promotion lies with CO SCMA, a PAC (Phase 2) is formed to assist in the process of ensuring that the principle of merit is applied fairly.

10. The CO SCMA and the PAC (Phase 2) meet immediately after the PAC (Phase 1). The CO SCMA is assisted by DARTY, the CAs, RMG and the SO1 PM GP SCMA. During this process, soldiers are considered for promotion clearance. The recommended adjustments to the promotion recommendations made by the PAC (Phase 1) are considered and any differences of opinion between SCMA and Corps not resolved during PAC (Phase 1) are again discussed before a final decision is made by CO SCMA. The final clearances for promotion are made by CO SCMA.

11. At each level of consideration, the factors examined in paragraph 7 above are again reviewed.

N.B: <u>There is no</u> Reference to numerical scores, only performance statements and wordpictures or appraisals in various forms.

12. When the Promotion Authority has made a determination as to the clearance/non-clearance status of each soldier, PM3 carries out the following action:

a. If the soldier is cleared and is filling an authorised establishment position at the higher rank, SCMA will raise an RO2 authorising the substantive, provisional or temporary promotion. A Promotion Series result letter may be dispatched if written confirmation is necessary and/or more information should be passed on to the soldier; or b. If the soldier is not an authorised establishment position of a higher rank, or is not cleared, he may expect a Promotion Series Result letter giving details of this.

Promotion Series Result Letters

13. After the RAA session during the Annual Promotion Series PM3 prepares a letter on each soldier considered, which outlines the details of the clearance/non-clearance and, where appropriate, details of the reasons for the decision under normal circumstances. The letters will be released to the soldier via his CO within four weeks of the conclusion of the corps session.

14. These letters should be used as a basis for counselling your soldiers. The soldier should initial the letter as having seen it and it should then be placed on the soldier's unit personal file.

Order of Promotion

15. Clearance in the Promotion Series does not mean immediate promotion unless the soldier is filling an authorised establishment position of the higher rank. Army needs may result in a soldier being promoted before one or more soldiers who cleared higher. When this occurs, and the soldier/s who cleared higher are not promoted before the next series, the soldier/s will be considered by the Promotion Authority for carry-over of the clearance. If authorised they will be placed at the top of next year's promotion list. This is happening more often as a result of the ACPERS-A three year posting tenure guideline.

16. If a soldier is offered a posting on promotion and refuses that posting for other than accepted compassionate reasons, then the soldier is by passed and the position is offered to the next soldier in line for promotion.

Withdrawal of Clearance

17. Automatic. All soldiers who were cleared at the Annual Promotion Series but were not promoted before 1 February of the next year will have their clearance automatically withdrawn. The only exception to this rule is described at paragraph 15 above.

18. **Formal.** Should a soldier be cleared for promotion and later fails to meet the requirements of that clearance or fails to continue to perform at a level worthy of promotion, CO SCMA may order that soldier's clearance be withdrawn.

FIELD ARTILLERY EQUIPMENT UPDATE

Hamel Gun

1. Issue to units of the new 105mm light field gun began in December 1988 when six guns were issued to the School of Artillery. 1 Fd Regt, 4 Fd Regt and 8/12 Mdm Regt have been equipped. This completes Phase 3 of the project, with 59 guns. Other Phase are:

Phase 4. The production of 46 guns for the ARes was approved in the 1986/87 Budget. The proposed issue schedule is:

* School of Artillery - 1 gun in Aug 91;

*	5/11 Fd Regt -	6 guns in Oct 91, and 6 guns in Dec 91;
*	7 Fd Regt -	6 guns in Mar 92, and 6 guns in May 92;
*	23 Fd Regt -	6 guns in Jul 92, and 6 guns in Sep 92.

Phase 5. The mandatory purchase of 10 000 rounds of Abbot Mk2 ammunition from the UK is complete.

Phase 6 and 7. These phases seek the Australian production of Abbot MK2 ammunition and the establishment of a Capability Reserve (CR). The phases are beyond the Five Year Development Plan (FYDP), and have not been approved.

Phase 8. The production of a further 43 guns for the ARes is covered by this phase. Again, the phase is beyond the FYDP.

Computer, Fire Control (CFC) / Portable All Arms Calculator (PAAC)

2. CFC and PAAC both refer to the same piece of equipment which is a hand held, special purpose computer which provides data for artillery fire control. Within the RAA, PAAC will remain as the commonly referred to name. In 1 Div, PAAC will be the back-up for the batteries equipped with IGC and eventually FACCS. For the ARes it will be the principle form of computing. PAAC uses software developed by the Proof & Experimental Group and the Defence Science and Technology Organisation (DSTO), with hardware produced by the Engineering Development Establishment and British Aerospace Australia (BAeA). The School of Artillery has been involved in software production and validation.

3. Conversion training for PAAC by a mobile team of instructors from the School of Artillery will start with the issue of PAAC, expected in late 1991.

Interim Gunnery Computer (IGC)

4. This artillery computer is an interim replacement for FACE until FACCS is available. The computer will use 'off-the-shelf' hardware and the software developed for PAAC. The IGC has a greater capacity than PAAC, with features that include:

- the ability to interchange software in the field;
- * larger memory;
- target records;
- * fire planning capability including a print-out;
- * bigger and better screen display; and
- * ability to exchange information between IGC's.
- 5. IGC should be introduced in RAA Regiments in early 1992.

Field Artillery Computerised Control System (FACCS)

6. The requirement for a computerised fire control system for artillery is being developed through FACCS. The central element of FACCS will be a ballistic computer at the field artillery batteries. In addition, an automated system of computers will be located in divisional, brigade, regimental, battery, and locating troop command posts. Interactive Hand Held Terminals (HHT) will be provided for remote cells, such as command parties and OP's. All equipment will be compatible with AUSTACCS.

7. A FACCS Test Bed has been established at the Artillery Centre. The Test Bed staff will produce the User Requirement Specifications, test prototypes for the man-machine interface, and co-ordinate DSTO research tasks. In addition, six monthly Progress Reports are produced. DSTO have given the project a high priority and have placed an engineering officer at the Test Bed to assist with the development.

8. FACCS will replace IGC. The planned date for issue is 1995-6.

Muzzle Velocity Measuring Equipment (MVME)

9. The MVME has replaced the obsolescent EVA radar. The doppler radar, which is either tripod mounted or can be fitted to the barrel of a gun, will measure the velocity of fired rounds. Fairey Australasia developed the equipment from in-service Firing Tables. Two MVME are allocated to each ARA Regiment, and six are located at the School of Artillery for training and use by the ARes.

Fall Of Shot Simulator (FOSS)

10. FOSS was developed by the Scientific Adviser at HQ 1 Div with assistance from 1 Fd Regt in 1984. BAeA has taken over the development of the project, with the Commonwealth to receive royalties from sales. The system consists of an inexpensive computer, slide projector, video projector, screen and tape readers; and will simulate indirect fire missions. FOSS I is in-service with:

- * RMC,
- * 1 Fd Regt,
- * 4 Fd Regt,
- * 8/12 Mdm Regt,
- * Inf Centre,
- * Avn Centre,
- * Armd Centre (purchased by Unit), and
- * Trg Gp's.
- 11. FOSS II has been issued to the following units:
 - * RMC,
 - * 1 Fd Regt,
 - * 4 Fd Regt,
 - * 8/12 Mdm Regt, and
 - * Inf Centre.

12. Software upgrades to FOSS II are continuing, although it should be noted a Fire Planning capability is not available, nor is there a capability for amendments during the sequence. BAeA are addressing this deficiency as part of the contract, and at no cost will upgrade the software for the Commonwealth.

13. DArty has raised an Equipment Entitlement Varation (EEV) to upgrade FOSS to FOSS II. A redistribution will result. It will be recommended that the latest versions have a 'PC Viewer (Electroboard)' for use with an Over Head Projector machine. Depending on costs, these items could be introduced in mid 1992.

Impulse Noise Hearing Protection

14. This is a long term project to provide equipment for the protection against the impulse noise of artillery. DSTO have gathered scientific evidence, especially conclusive medical results, to support the project. A proposal for equipment procurement is currently being drafted.

Capability Analysis Papers

15. Brief mention needs to be made of Capability Analysis Papers because they are a major project for the Directorate, and therefore the RAA. Although the development of these papers is the responsibility of Force Development in HQ ADF, much assistance has to be obtained from the Heads of Corps. The papers will influence the direction of the RAA in the future, so it is imperative they are well planned, researched and persuasively written. It will be just as important that other RAA organisations collaborate in their development to guarantee the best solution. From the Capability Analysis Papers, deficiencies can be identified and options offered to resolve deficiencies.

16. In the ADF the process of changing the structure of the 'force-in-being' is by the process of Force Development. Strategic guidance now clearly directs the ADF's attention to operations in the defence and security of Australia. Therefore, through Capability Analysis Papers the RAA must address its military capabilities, and they include:

- * organisation,
- * doctrine,
- * materiel,
- training,
- * readiness,
- * sustainment,
- facilities, and
- * logistics.

17. The Directorate has started on the first of these Papers, titled Indirect Fire Support. The aim of the paper is to analyse the requirement for artillery in accordance with Australia's Defence Policy. In addition, papers on artillery survey and ammunition are being written and others will follow.

AIR DEFENCE EQUIPMENT UPDATE

Force Structure Review

1. The Air Defence Capability was confirmed by the Force Structure Review in Mar 91. The manpower question remains unresolved with changes probable in the near future.

Rapier

2. MEA and EDE are continuing to examine the reason for Rapier equipment/missile failures in past firings. It is noted that the 110 AD Bty Rapier firings from 6-8 May 91 achieved an 85% success rate.

Rapier Mode IV IFF

3. The Army Development Committee (ADC) is scheduled to consider the proposal for Mk 12 Mode 4 IFF systems on 21 Nov 91. With the life of Rapier equipment being approved to the year 2000, the procurement of Mode IV IFF has been given a high priority by DARTY-A as a necessary means to make Rapier compatible with other ADF IFF users.

VLLADS Alerting And Cueing System (VACS)

4. The Army Capability Proposal (ACP) was considered by the ADC in Mar 91 with the requirement being acknowledged. Although being upgraded to a major capability requirement, it is anticipated that money will be allocated in 92/93 for its procurement. VACS is again being considered by the ADC on 3 Oct 91. Work on procuring night sights for RBS 70 is also continuing.

Rapier Target Tracking Trainer

5. The unreliability and high servicing costs associated with the Tracker Trainers held at the AD Wing and 16 AD Regt has resulted in DARTY-A submitting an EEV for its replacement. It is possible that it will be replaced by a system similar to that used in the UK known as the Rapier Classroom Air Defence Tracker Trainer which requires minimal maintenance and instructor support.


